As I write this letter, it has been a little over a year since we took in our first resident, and what a year it has been! I am so very privileged and grateful to serve as the Executive Director of St. Gianna's Place. Since I have come on board in September 2019, we have had fourteen residents and seven babies have been born who may not have been born if it wasn't for the generosity, vision and commitment of our donors, staff, volunteers and board of directors. Some of our expectant residents came with toddlers, some with school-aged children, and we have been able to support them all! Some left before giving birth due to the Coronavirus, returning to families they were previously estranged from.

The growth we have experienced in one short year is nothing short of amazing! We have developed new programming, hired skilled staff, and hope to expand our living space in the very near future. We have strengthened community relationships, put many residents through education programs, and reunited families. All of this is only possible because of you! My goal for 2021 is to double our number of residents. We can only do that with your continued support. St. Gianna's Place is a Christ-centered ministry, rooted in Gospel values. Our mission is to support each expectant mother who comes to us to transform her life and the lives of her children. Every woman who contacts St. Gianna's Place is treated with dignity and respect and we cherish the opportunity to show each one God's love.



When I come to work each day, I am always amazed at the activity surround-

ing me. A typical day always begins with morning prayer, followed by

breakfast and chores. There are doctor's appointments, meal planning and food shopping, weekly goal-setting with each resident individually,

the help of their moms and sometimes staff. There are residents coming and going from jobs, volunteering in the community, high school classes, GED pro-

grams, LNA programs, cosmetology school, AA meetings and Intensive Outpatient Programs. There are in-house trainings like Nutrition class, Faith Formation, Budget Buddies, Parenting Class and Cooking Class. We offer residents exercise programs, sewing instruction, arts and crafts class, and we



even attempted our own organic vegetable garden this year! At the end of the day the kitchen is busy as the residents begin to prepare the evening meal. Gathered as a family, supper is on, and always followed by

evening prayer. Mostly prayers of gratitude from extremely grateful women and children.

There are days that are heartbreaking and filled with tears and others that are heartwarming filled with

joy and laughter. All blessed by God and made possible by you, for without the kindness and generosity of our donors and volunteers our mission would not be possible.
