Elizabeth Breuder's prolife passion stems from her Catholic Italian heritage that celebrates faith and family. A native of Massachusetts, she graduated from Emmanuel College with a BA. She majored in French and minored in Secondary Education and Spanish.

Elizabeth is the mother of ten children and has 17 grandchildren. For 27 years, she traveled with her husband, an Air Force physician.

Her ministry began in 1990 when she began spearheading public opposition to Planned Parenthood's sex education and abortion agenda.

In Blytheville, Arkansas, she started a local right-to-life chapter. She also co-founded United People For Public Schools (UPPS), an ecumenical community-based group that succeeded in promoting "Abstinence Only" education in the public schools.

In Plattsburgh, NY, she served as Legislative Chair of Champlain Valley Right To Life. There she led opposition to the illegal expansion of Planned Parenthood's office into an abortion "clinic."

In New Hampshire, Elizabeth successfully crusaded against an abortionist teaching sex education in Bedford schools. The ensuing controversy sparked national debate when highlighted in the video "Live Free or Die." This pseudo-documentary was aired on PBS and later awarded by NARAL.

Elizabeth has served as a trustee and Vice President of the NH Right to Life. She prays and sidewalk counsels at Planned Parenthood Manchester. There she has witnessed the desperate plight of homeless mothers seeking abortions as a last resort. This experience has convinced her that pro-lifers must help moms in crisis through homes like Saint Gianna's Place.

Elizabeth is a former board member of BirthRight, Manchester. She also serves as state coordinator of the National Apostolate "Prayers for Life".
