A Grace-Filled Journey at St. Gianna's Place



Resident Spotlight: Meet Carolyn

My name is Carolyn and this is my story. After graduating from college, I found myself in serious financial difficulty because of student debt and because of the college's poor career guidance. Soon after, I found myself facing a profound moral dilemma. I was living in a women's sober house in New Jersey, far away from my family and hometown in New Hampshire. Here I was, pregnant, overwhelmed with fear and struggling to keep my head above water. The women I lived with in the sober house convinced me to make an appointment at Planned Parenthood.

On the day of the appointment, as I sat on my doorstep waiting for a ride service. It never arrived and I realized that this was no coincidence. God had intervened. But soon after, I was told to leave the house and I became homeless.

Alone and with nowhere to go, I saw no way out. I found myself in a park with my suitcase, looking up at the sky, deciding to surrender to God's will. It was then that I decided to confide in my sister, despite

my shame. She flew me home to NH and I began the journey to healing and self-discovery.

My path led me to St. Gianna's Place; a place I never expected to find. Here, I discovered the care and support I needed to restore balance in my life. St. Gianna's Place provided not only a safe haven for my son and me but also the resources to succeed. I am now attending AA and have a sponsor. I have a bank account and am saving money for the first time. St. Gianna's has taught me about God and about the Catholic faith and I plan on getting baptized along with my son. St. Gianna's has taught me values and how to live with guidelines-something my life had lacked. Now I will raise my son with what I have learned and he will have a better life for it.

Looking at my son now, I am filled with love and awe. He is happy, healthy, and whole, and I have the privilege of being his mother. I find peace today by accepting the things I cannot change, having the courage to change the things I can, and being aware of the difference.


